his classic 1922 bungalow was stripped of its millwork, built-ins, and much of its Arts & Crafts charm back in the 1950s and 1970s. When new owners purchased the house, they decided to renew the bungalow's vintage style while reconfiguring the entire house to create an open floor plan more in keeping with a modern lifestyle. The kitchen demonstrates the approach: Relocated from a more interior location, it is now a functional space that is connected to the dining and living rooms, and features natural light and views to the backyard. Period features include honed soapstone countertops, custom white oak cabinetry, oak millwork, and a new dining room buffet that provides a serving area adjacent to the kitchen.

fter she saved a 1905 Craftsman house on Lake Minnetonka from destruction, this homeowner wanted an entertaining kitchen—one designed to accommodate large parties and multiple cooks yet intimate enough for her own daily use. David Heide and Brad Belka designed a kitchen scaled to her various needs, all encapsulated within period-style cabinetry, tile, and finishes. A workspace designed for one includes the cooktop, ovens, sink, and refrigerator, while additional prep areas accommodate multiple cooks. The oversized center island includes an integrated refrigerator, freezer drawers, and extra storage; the custom-designed octagonal table provides another serving area; and the bar holds a refrigerator, icemaker, and dishwater. The space now holds everything an inveterate entertainer could desire.
